Students will present their findings on the organ and diseases that can affect the body part through an informative poster.

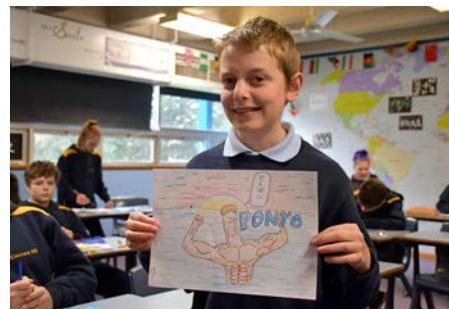


Seniors prepare for HSC Music exams

This week they have printed miniature models and, if happy with their designs, will print their full sized displays next week.

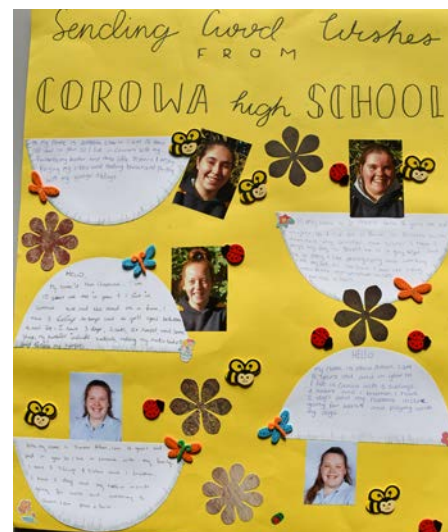
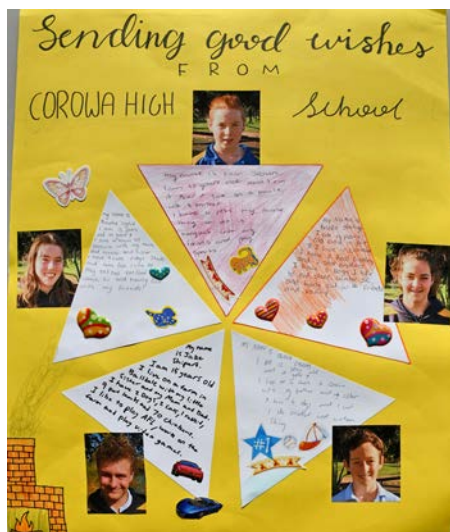


HSC study days via video conference
